The Student Presidential Tour is docent-led and includes the Clinton Center's orientation film, a tour of its Cabinet Room, Life in the White House, Oval Office, and the current temporary exhibit. Students will have a discussion on tour to connect the various roles of the President (Chief Executive, Commander in Chief, Chief Diplomat, Ceremonial Head of State) through the featured permanent exhibitions. This tour will last one hour and 15 minutes.
